## Volunteer Corner: Serving and Growing

In my months as a volunteer at DESC, I've probably talked with 1,200 individuals, mostly on the phone, some in person. I've fielded calls, packed groceries and sorted clothing.

Clients have brought me to tears with their stories of medical problems, family issues and financial reversals. Some start crying themselves, like the grandmother who was so happy when I told her we could clothe the grandchildren she had stepped in to raise. Men and women come into the clothing center carrying all their belongings after a night spent on the ground.

When I get a call on Tuesday from someone whose electricity is scheduled to be shut off the next day, I have to say that we can only set up appointments for financial assistance on Monday. I always try to point the callers to addi onal sources of support. I remind them that we can provide them with food and clothing.

And almost always, they say, "Thank you."

I've learned and grown in my faith by trying to help others.
