When school lets out for the summer, most families struggle to come up with ways to keep their children entertained for the next couple of months. For the many families that we serve at DESC, their worries are compounded as they try to figure out how to keep them fed as well.

With children out of school, they no longer have the benefit of free breakfast and lunch.

This in turn means their parents and guardians must pay for three meals a day versus one. When this happens, sacrifices, in the form of late bills or missed medicine, must be made.

While donations of food items are appreciated, financial donations to DESC allow us to maximize your support and our impact, as we are able to stock our pantry with nutritional food purchased at a fraction of the price.

This summer, Anna is taking care of eight children, including her own children and her nieces and nephews. While she does look forward to spending their break with them, she has also had to learn how to stretch out her trip to the grocery store.

With each bag of groceries we give to families like Anna's, we make it possible for them to enjoy all that summer has to offer. If you have the means to help, please use the envelope enclosed in this newsletter.

#### **Did You Know?**

During the summer, families with school children come to DESC twice as often for grocery assistance so that they can feed their kids home on summer break who are not receiving school breakfasts and lunches.

# A Special Visit from Riverside Presbyterian

On Tuesdays and Thursdays during the month of June, we had the pleasure of welcoming upcoming 4th and 5th graders from the Riverside Presbyterian Church as they toured DESC as part of their VBS mission trip.

During their first visit, they met with Mary, and our beloved office dog Clarice, to learn more about our history and our three-fold mission of giving. She took them on a brief tour through our food pantry, which was overflowing with food from our recent summer grocery order.

Afterwards, they spent the rest of their visit in the Clothing Center, where together, we looked over some passages of scripture that highlight God's concern for the poor and our mission to provide them with necessary provisions.

The children were attentive and respectful when we moved the discussion towards the variety of reasons that bring people through our doors.

To help them understand our need for clothes, shoes, backpacks, and toiletry items, we asked the students to fill clothing orders for imaginary clients.

As they worked, they struggled, as we do in the clothing ministry, to find suitable clothing for a size small man



or woman, comfortable shoes that fit, or maternity clothing for women in need. They also learned our inventory of children's clothing items, and especially infant and baby items, hardly meet the demand we see every day.

While we appreciate our little visitors, the true reward came when many of the students returned shortly after their visit with their parents to donate clothing, books, shoes, blankets, and stuffed animals from their own closets and bedrooms.

We graciously accepted their donations, as in this particular season, these items never stay long on our shelves.
We find ourselves needing school uniforms for returning students, as well as clothing, bibs, blankets, and wash cloths for babies and infants.

As many of our visiting students left DESC, many of them told us that when they grow older, they would like to return to give away clothing for real. It is our hope that we see their faces brighten our doors again.
