The back to school rush for clothing always demands more than we can gather through donations. This group graciously set out to help fill these gaps by meeting at Sharon's house, in Venetia, on Tuesdays and creating girl's dresses and jumpers in various sizes and patterns. Thus, Sewing Hope for DESC was born. This group consists of a mix of talents and strengths that blend well together with Sharon Meehan (the Organizer), Karen Lee (Computer Savy), Elaine Lundahl (Practical Advisor), Joan Altes (Creative Vision), Cheryl Peek (Bargain Hunter), Kellie Perkins ("Iron" Woman), and Helen Bliss (who sews at home).

Needless to say, the Clothing Ministry workers were all blown away, not only by the generosity of time and effort from this group, but also by the number of beautiful dresses that began accumulating in our empty bins. Some of the material was purchased and some was donated. Most were gorgeous floral prints, sturdy denim for jumpers, and other cute assorted designs and fabrics. Since then, DESC has been able to give EVERY girl client at least one dress, often more.



SHARE BLESSINGS

Today at the DESC window a client "Sonja" asked us for underwear, socks and bedding. She had had an unfortunate bed bug invasion in her apartment and lost everything. I feel compelled to share her story as it was so touching.

Sonja and her son were living in an apartment in the Arlington area. Occasionally she would open her home to acquaintances that were having temporary hardships. Recently, she opened her heart and home to someone in passing, who later admitted to knowingly bringing bed bugs from a hotel where they previously stayed. Sonja readily admitted to an angry outburst and evicting this person. Sonja had never dealt with bed bugs before but knew she had to get rid of EVERYTHING in her apartment. She lost all her furniture, clothing and belongings. The only thing she had left were her kitchen utensils.

Sonja came down to DESC for help. She said she had not been here in a while and that starting with clothing was the first step of getting her life back. Because of the wonderful response to our underwear campaign, we were able to give Sonja plenty of much needed underwear, socks, and bras, as well as clothing, bedding, blankets, sleepwear and groceries. She was overwhelmed by our ability to help in this time of crisis.

Sonja told us that the next Sunday she went to church and asked forgiveness for her outburst to her guest. She said she rededicated her life to Christ that day and is now free of this burden, has been forgiven, and is full of praise. She says her apartment is empty but her heart is full!
